# CHABAD HOUSE AT RUTGERS HOUSING TERMS & REGULATIONS AGREEMENT

## FALL 2024 - SPRING 2025

- The \$200 initial application fee is non-refundable.
- All residents must submit a current photo and two reference letters from their school or Jewish seminary principal or family rabbi.
- In accordance with Rutgers University policy, all students are required to be fully vaccinated in advance of moving into Chabad House.
- All residents must have a medical form completed and signed by their physician. We must be informed of any mental and health conditions, including medications that the student has been prescribed and will have in their room.
- All residents are required to sign up for our meal plan. Students' meal plans are for personal use only and are not transferable. The student may only choose from either the Complete 255 Meal Plan or the Traditional 225 Meal Plan. Please choose one of the following:  Complete 255 Plan  Traditional 225 Plan
- PLEASE NOTE that Shabbat meals are free of charge. Students signed up for the Complete or Traditional Meal Plan may use up to 10 of their meals each semester for guests. Please see the section on the meal plan for detailed terms and policies.
- Rooms are confirmed and assigned after interview process, receipt of documents and upon receipt of this signed contract and waivers and the housing/meal plan fall semester fee.
- This Housing Agreement is for **BOTH** the Fall and Spring Semester. Please see attached for the terms.
- The balance for Fall and Spring semester is due no later than August 1, 2024. Please see fee schedule for details and deadlines.
- Housing Cancellations prior to June 30, 2024 are subject to a \$1000 cancellation fee. There will be one semester of housing deducted from any cancellations between 7/1 - 7/31/23. No refunds or credits will be issued for cancellations after August 1, 2024 nor after students move in and receive keys. There is an option to defer all monies paid to a future semester housing or meal plan.
- There is a mandatory \$600 contribution towards our Annual Dinner Gala which includes one reservation and a half page ad.
- Official Move-in days for Fall Semester are Sunday, September 1, and Monday, September 2, between 10AM-7PM. Details for move-in day will be emailed to the residents.
- Residents are not permitted to remain at the Chabad House dormitory during the Thanksgiving, Winter, and Spring breaks as the University is closed. Residents should go home during this time but not move out of their rooms.
- The Chabad Dorm is closed during the following dates: Thanksgiving Recess: Wednesday, November 27, 2024 to Sunday, December 1, 2024; Winter Recess: Monday, December 23, 2024 to Sunday, January 19, 2025. Spring Recess: Friday, March 14, 2025 to Sunday, March 23, 2025.
- Official Move-out day: All rooms must be vacate their rooms within 24 hours of their last final exam OR Thursday, May 15, 2025 by 10:00am, whichever comes first. All keys must be returned.
- Please see Dorm Chabad calendar for a more detailed list of dates and times.
- Rooms are assigned solely at the discretion of Chabad House. Rooms are assigned as double or triple occupancy. Rooms are to be used by assignee(s) only. Rooms may not be sublet or transferred to another student.
- Residents are responsible for informing their guests of Chabad House policies.
- This agreement, attached addendum and waiver, reflect the entire understanding of all parties.

## COVID-19 ADDENDA

Chabad House – Lubavitch, holds paramount the health, safety and welfare of our community. Taking steps to reduce the risk of Covid-19 is the shared responsibility of every member of our community. Therefore, we will be implementing and requiring continued adherence to health and safety standards and providing guidance for community living on the Rutgers University campus for 2024-2025. Acknowledging that there will be changes to the traditional Chabad House experience, we are issuing the following addendum to our Housing Agreement to provide students with a greater detail about these shared obligations and policies. Please take the time to carefully review each item on our contract and these addenda to avoid misunderstandings.

1. Students requesting Housing and Dining from Chabad House – Lubavitch, understand that Rutgers University and New Jersey Department of Health may change Covid-19 regulations or restriction at any time. It is the student's choice to be housed at Chabad House at Rutgers.
2. The Student acknowledges the inherent risk of exposure to Covid-19, can exist in any public place where people are present. Covid-19, like influenza, is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death, particularly in people with underlying medical conditions or the elderly. By entering and residing in the Chabad House residence hall, you voluntarily assume all risks associated with communal living, as in any shared living environment, those risks include potential exposure to Covid-19, influenza or other communicable diseases.
3. You thereby agree to release Chabad House - Lubavitch, from any and all damages, liability, claims, expenses, or loss (collectively, "claims") resulting from or arising out of your use of space within Chabad House's building, including those related to the potential exposure to contagious viruses like Covid-19 or Influenza, and to indemnify and hold harmless Chabad House - Lubavitch, from any claims resulting from or arising out of your breach of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
4. The Student acknowledges a shared obligation to prioritize health and safety for the benefit of the entire community.
5. Chabad House will continue to implement and modify its cleaning protocols as mandated by federal or state directives and as suggested by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the interest of minimizing spread of diseases. To the extent it is reasonably practicable; administration will require residents to maintain appropriate sanitation standards within their personal living space as well as shared spaces in order to reduce the spread of diseases within the residence hall.
6. The Student agrees to adhere to Chabad House expectations intended to minimize risk of exposure to Covid-19 or Influenza consistent with health and safety guidance.
7. Adherence to any health and safety requirements that Chabad House reasonably deems appropriate applies to all residents, staff, guests and visitors and extends to all aspects of residential living, including dorm rooms, bathrooms, kitchenettes, lounges, dining halls, and other common spaces.
8. In accordance with Rutgers University policy all students are required to be fully vaccinated in advance of moving into Chabad House in the fall.
9. Students are required to self-report any signs of illness.
10. The Student agrees to disclose to the administration immediately upon notification of a positive Covid-19 or Influenza test or if symptomatic, and follow instructions to isolate immediately in order to limit exposure to the community.
11. A resident recommended to quarantine or isolate may be advised to go home for the remainder of their quarantine/isolation period when at all possible.
12. At any time, Chabad House may request or require a resident to leave their assigned room when it is reasonably determined that resident's continued presence in the housing community poses an actual or potential health or safety risk for community members. Residents are required to comply with requests to leave their assigned space due to public health emergencies and failure to do so is a violation of this Agreement and may subject a resident to emergency removal from their assigned space.
13. Students are required to comply with all health and safety law, orders, ordinances, policies, regulations and guidance adopted by Chabad House. This guidance may be updated to reflect state health and Rutgers University mandates. Chabad House may require student to leave the residence hall if the Student's presence poses a health or safety risk to the community.
14. Guests are defined as anyone not residing at Chabad House. Residents that live at Chabad House are responsible for their guests behavior and to ensure they adhere to all policies when those are in effect. In the event of a Covid-19 outbreak, we have the right to prohibit residents from hosting overnight guests or visitors to their rooms.
15. Upon reasonable notice, Chabad House – Lubavitch, reserves the right to terminate this agreement due to public health emergency and/or directives from Rutgers University or New Jersey State, in the interest of the health and safety of all students.
16. In the event of the closure of our facility due to circumstances beyond our control, such as a Covid-19 outbreak, there will not be any refunds for the Housing portion of this contract. Chabad House will apply any pro-rated credit towards future semesters. Housing credits are non-transferable. The meal plan payment will be credited (towards a future semester) or refunded at 75% of the prorated, per-diem amount. Meal plans credits are non-transferable.
17. All Covid-19 policies and protocols are based on Rutgers University Student Health, CDC, and NJ Department of Health guidelines.

Chabad House – Lubavitch is committed to supporting our students in their return to campus during this unprecedented time and recognizes the value of the on-campus residential experience. The above information has been provided to allow students to make an informed decision about living at Chabad House for the 2024-2025 school year. While the above is intended to provide some detail, there may be additional modifications needed as the year progresses and we track the impact of Covid-19 on our community and Rutgers University campus. As always, we will endeavor to update you with timely information about specific health and safety guidance important for our community. In the event that the federal, state, or local authorities issue new guidelines or regulations, then all parties agree to abide by such directives. In addition all parties agree to execute any necessary documents. The completed signatures of both student and parent on The Housing Terms & Regulations Agreement and below, accepts all the terms listed above and acknowledges informed consent.

# CHABAD HOUSE AT RUTGERS HOUSING TERMS & REGULATIONS AGREEMENT

The Chabad House dormitory operates in accordance with Jewish Law. All the Chabad House rabbis are available to answer and guide students with any questions they have pertaining to Jewish Law. Please note that Rabbi Mendy Carlebach, administrator of Chabad House, is the final halachic authority on any and all decisions based on Jewish Law as it pertains to the dorm. This residential arrangement is an integral part of Chabad House's religious activities, is essential to the religious mission of the institution, and is intended to enable residents to participate fully in a religiously-centered experience not otherwise available to non-residents. Please note that on Shabbat and Jewish Holidays, students are asked to be considerate and not interfere or disrupt the public observance of Shabbat or Yom Tov. Elevator service will not be available at these times. The Chabad House residence suites feature separate male and female facilities. Male residents and male students only are allowed in the men's dorm area. This includes individual rooms, lounges, gym, the corridor and the elevator of the dorm area. Similarly, female residents and female students only are allowed in the women's dormitory area. The Director of Chabad Housing reserves the right to reassign a room assignment at any time, or to suspend, terminate or add a fine to, a residence agreement if the rules are not kept. There will be no refund of any fees when the director terminates a residence agreement due to breach of regulations. Fine amounts for contract infractions are at the discretion of Chabad House at a starting point of \$100 and up. This contract is for both Fall and Spring Semester. Residents that voluntarily move out, waive the right to their room and voids this contract. No refund will be issued per our policy. Chabad House reserves the right to assign the vacated room to a new or existing resident. Please read and sign the addendum attached for detailed COVID-19 policy.

Residents have individual financial responsibility for damage to Chabad House property in their assigned room and/or shared group responsibility for damage to Chabad House property in general. Students are required to keep the room clean and well maintained and to return the room in the same condition as it was when students moved in. If there are no damages, students will receive, via US Mail, their security deposit in full towards the end of the summer of 2025. If there is damage, the Chabad House Housing Office will investigate all causes of damage. Evidence of negligent, careless, mischievous, or malicious acts, or violation of University regulations will result with student(s) being appropriately billed. The financial assessment to the student shall be determined by the Director of Chabad House Housing. Residents will be issued room, elevator and/or building keys and codes (as applicable), upon moving in, providing all fees are paid. There will be a \$60 per key and \$50 per fob charge for lost keys/fobs that need replacement or if unreturned at end of year. Lost keys jeopardize Chabad House Security. PLEASE ensure your keys are always safe. In addition you will receive electronic fobs and combination lock codes which is the resident's responsibility to not share with non-residents. This will help ensure the safety of all Chabad House residents. Students and parents agree to pay reasonable legal costs or fees required to collect any unpaid bills or for room damage, etc.

Residents are expected to turn off lights, air conditioning systems, water, radios, televisions, computers, etc., when they leave their rooms. **Important:** When outside temperatures fall to freezing, Heating System must remain on at all times to prevent water pipes from bursting. Windows should be kept closed especially during wind conditions to prevent windows from breaking. Residents have individual financial responsibility for damage to Chabad House property in their assigned room and a shared group responsibility for damage to Chabad House property in general. Residents may not interfere or disable Chabad House fire-safety & security measures. Except in case of perceived emergency, rooms will only be entered upon notice to student. Students must abide by fire code regulations which prohibit extension cords, decorative lighting, wires running under rugs or mattresses, outlet strips plugged into each other, open flames, etc. Residents are strongly encouraged to purchase rental insurance from any insurance company of choice as an added protective personal protective measure.

Repairs and maintenance needs, including broken furniture, malfunctioning equipment and fixtures, water leaks, burned out light bulbs, or any other matters requiring attention should be reported to a Resident Assistant and the administrative office by emailing [service@chabadnj.org](mailto:service@chabadnj.org) or stopping by administration office on second floor. Please do not give maintenance request directly to the maintenance staff. All request for repairs must be reported to the RA or administrative office. Residents should not attempt to repair or replace any equipment or fixtures. Chabad House is not liable if injury or death occurs from such action. If a resident(s) is found tampering with equipment or fixtures, they will be assessed fines between \$20 and \$100 per occurrence. Residents are responsible for plunging toilets and cleaning up water from overflowing toilets, showers, and sinks and keeping their bathrooms free of mold by regular and routine cleaning.

The following are prohibited in and around residence facilities: Smoking, E-Cigarettes/Vapes, Beer & Alcohol, Drugs, Firearms and other weapons, chemicals, fireworks, and explosives, gasoline, benzene, and other flammable liquids, space heaters and open flame devices, hookahs, pets and laboratory animals, liquid-filled beds, or any other structure unless specifically approved by the director. Inappropriate language and materials are prohibited. Cooking appliances such as electric skilllets, immersion coils, toaster ovens, broilers, hot plates, etc. are prohibited. Nothing may be attached to the walls without explicit permission and supervision of Chabad House. There shall be no soliciting or canvassing in the building whatsoever without written approval from the Director. Students shall be courteous and friendly to fellow students and Chabad House staff. A student may lose their rights to housing or dining services for failure to abide by the terms and conditions described in this agreement and introduced conditions at resident hall meetings. Residents are required to attend orientations and workshops. A comprehensive list of expectations and prohibitions are included in the Student Handbook.

Chabad House strives to provide every student with a safe, welcoming community that includes a fully furnished room. Room assignments are based on availability and are at the discretion of Chabad House. Rooms are assigned as double or triple occupancy. Whenever possible, roommate requests are honored. Room change/swap requests due to roommate conflicts are considered based on availability and only after a mediation process with a Resident Assistant, Rabbis, and/or administration. All residents must strive to resolve conflicts with their roommates and abide by the mediation agreements. All pertinent students must agree to a room change before a final decision is made. Room re-assignment or room swaps are NOT allowed during the first three weeks of the semester.

All guests, in public areas, are subject to the rules of Chabad House as applicable to resident students. Public areas include the student lounges, library, dining halls, synagogues, and rest rooms. All overnight guests must be approved by administration and have a consent form on file. Roommates must be informed and approve guest. Hosts are responsible for their guests behavior.

Chabad House reserves the right to rent its public/common areas such as the Ball Room (Dining Hall), Cafe, Main Synagogue, and/or Library for private events during the academic year. Students may not disrupt or interrupt private events.

Residents may bring bicycles as long as they are parked and locked in the bike rack in the parking lot. Bikes are not allowed in the building or rooms under any circumstance. Chabad House is not responsible for stolen, lost or damaged bicycles or cars left anywhere on our property. All residents with a bike are advised to register them with Rutgers PD, have an adequate lock and bike cover. **Parking privileges in the Chabad House parking lot are not available to students. Unauthorized parked cars are subject to tow at the owner's expense.**

Resident students may receive mail and packages at the Chabad House address: 170 College Avenue, New Brunswick, 08901. All mail and packages must be picked up immediately. We are not responsible for any lost/stolen mail or packages. Chabad House is not responsible for lost /stolen personal property left anywhere in the building. **Please note that our facility and its public areas are monitored and recorded by security cameras.**

# CHABAD HOUSE AT RUTGERS MEAL PLAN TERMS & REGULATIONS AGREEMENT

Chabad House residents are required to have a Chabad House meal plan and may choose from the Complete 255 or Traditional 225 meal plan.

The Chabad House Meal Plan provides daily kosher meals when the university is in session. The program begins with dinner on the Sunday of Move-In and continues until the last day of final exams, for a total of thirty-two (32) weeks. All Shabbat & Holiday meals are free and not deducted from your meal plan. Shabbat dinner on Friday nights and lunches on Saturday are served after prayer services. There is dinner served to Chabad Dorm residents after Shabbos or after a Holiday during the winter months. A schedule of services and meal times is sent via email and posted on social media each week. There are no services or meals served when Chabad House is closed during Thanksgiving, Winter or Spring breaks.

Meal plans may not be altered after the first week of the semester. It is the student's responsibility to use up the meals they signed up for within the semester and they will not be rolled over into the following semester. Meal plans are non-transferable to another student or sibling. In the event of a mandatory closing due to a public health emergency, the meal plan payment will be credited (towards a future semester) or refunded at 75% of the prorated, per-diem amount.

Special perks per plan: Complete Plan - 10 guest meal passes. Traditional Plan: 10 guest meal passes. Chabad House Meal Plan students may bring guests to meals. A "guest" can only use this privilege up to 5 times per semester. They cannot be a "guest" for someone else afterwards. All guests are subject to same rules of conduct as students enrolled in a meal plan. Regular student guest fees are: Breakfast – \$10.00, Brunch or Lunch -\$18.00, and Dinner -\$23.00. Non-student guest fees are: Breakfast - \$12.00, Lunch - \$20.00, Dinner - \$25.00. We accept cash, checks, credit/debit cards, Venmo and Paypal as payment. There is no charge for Shabbat guests but reservations may be required.

We may not be able to accommodate all special dietary needs and we do not cook personal meals but we give special attention to food allergies such as not cooking with tree nuts or peanuts, sesame seeds or sesame oil and we provide gluten-free and vegetarian options. However, some ingredients used in our cooking may have been manufactured in a facility that processes milk, eggs, fish, tree nuts, wheat, peanuts and/or soybeans. In addition, there may be items such as peanut butter available as a spread in our dining hall or pastries and assorted food items that may have been made on shared equipment with foods containing peanuts and tree nuts. To make us aware of any dietary restrictions or allergies, please contact the Dining Program Manager at [diningmanager@chabadnj.org](mailto:diningmanager@chabadnj.org). All students should review the weekly menu, plan their meals and contact the dining service with any questions or concerns.

The Chabad House Meals are served buffet style. Operating on an honor system, we expect students to respect all the rules and regulations. Students may serve themselves the recommended daily portions and reduce waste by not taking an excessive amount of food. There will be portion control on main items in order for everyone to have the opportunity to take. You may not eat a meal and then pack up additional food to go. (Exception: if you are packing up to go for your next scheduled meal, then it is permissible and it will count as an additional meal. Please inform the service desk of your intention.) Under no circumstances may you pack up a meal for anyone else or serve food to anyone that has not paid, at any time. Take-out meals are available when arranged for in advance and ordered at the service desk. Portions are limited for takeout orders. If you have a hearty appetite, you are permitted to use up to two of your meals at one time.

All students and guests are required to clear their table and discard all trash before leaving the dining hall/cafe. Outside food or drinks may not be brought into any area of the dining hall at any time. Further details of meal plan conditions and rules of conduct are included in the Student Handbook and are subject to change based on Chabad House Administration and Rutgers University, federal, state, or local mandates.

All students and guests are recommended to wear proper face coverings in all indoor public areas if not feeling well and may order a take-out meal. All students are required to wash their hands or use hand sanitizer upon entering our building and before touching food or servingware in the dining hall. Dining hall/Cafe furnishings cannot be rearranged by students. . Please ask any questions at the service desk or email [diningservice@chabadnj.org](mailto:diningservice@chabadnj.org). All students and guests are required to clear their table and discard all trash before leaving. Outside food or drinks may not be brought into any area of the dining hall or cafe at any time.

There shall be no soliciting or canvassing in the building whatsoever without written approval from the Director.
